Its topics include royal absolutism, the Enlightenment, the French Revolution and Napoleon Bonaparte, the Industrial Revolution, the age of nationalism, European imperialism, World War I, World War II, the Cold War, the rise of the "Permissive Society," the fall of the Soviet Union, the wars in the former Yugoslavia and the recent revival of nationalist politics.

Roman Civilization to 476 AD -T/Th 2:30-3:45 PM

This course charts the rise and development of Rome from the advent of the monarchy through the republican and imperial periods to the breakdown of central power in the face of the Germanic invasions of the fifth century.



From shabby beginnings on the side of a hill in central Italy, Rome rose to become the dominant power in Europe and the Mediterranean militarily, economically and culturally, a position it sustained for a period of almost 700 years—from the 2nd century BC to at least the 5th century AD. No other single western state has achieved such dominance for such a length of time. As a result, no other single culture has affected the development of the modern world as much as the Romans.
