Programs that have been developed to set standards of care for food animals, ideally using input from all stakeholders.










Standards of care








2nd **party** = can have an association with the farm (e.g., veterinarian, Holstein Canada, etc.)

3rd **party** = cannot have any association with the farm




What is **mandatory**?


Depends on the program, but often includes:


- ✓ Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship (VCPR)
- ✓ Housing that allows animals to rest comfortably
- ✓ Good access to feed and water
- ✓ Segregation area for sick animals
- ✓ Pain control for painful procedures
- ✓ Individual animal identification
- ✓ Prompt, acceptable method for euthanasia
- √ No unnecessary procedures (e.g., tail-docking)


Body Condition Scoring

2 = Hair loss (hair loss >quarter NO swelling)



3 = Swelling or Lesion




